### STOCKWELL

**STOCKWELL** - The Revd. Joseph Samuel Stockwell was rector of Wilton (with Netherhampton, Ditchampton and Bulbridge). He was born on 5<sup>th</sup> June, 1798, the third son and seventh child of Revd. Thomas Stockwell, rector of Stratford Tony, Wiltshire, and his wife Ann WATERIDGE. The other children were Ann 1789, Mary 1791, Thomas 1793, Sarah Jane 1794, Daniel Joseph 1795, Sarah (or Sally) 1797, Jane Elizabeth 1801, Frances 1803, Jane 1804 and Francis 1806.

Joseph married Ann CARDEW (born Penryn, Cornwall, ca 1802) in September 1832 (see diary ref: 9 9 1832) at Curry Mallet, Somerset.

Joseph and Ann had five known children, all girls. First, Anne, born 1833, then twins Maryan and Helen who, according to Charlotte, were born on 19<sup>th</sup> January 1835. Although there is no baptism for Helen, there is a burial recorded at Wilton on 9<sup>th</sup> September, 1835 (7 months). Another Helen appears on the later censuses, born ca 1837. The fourth surviving child was Adah Louisa, born 5<sup>th</sup> April, 1839.

Charlotte called on the Wilton Stockwells regularly, often during her visits to Netherhampton or to Salisbury. Likewise, she visited the "Miss Stockwells", referring to Joseph's unmarried sisters, including Jane and Frances.

Joseph Stockwell later became rector of Wylde, where he, his wife and their four girls are found on the 1851 census. On the 1861 census, only Helen remains unmarried and living with her parents. The eldest girl, Ann, married Matthew Skinner LONGMORE in 1855. Of her sisters, Maryan, later married Robert HASSELL in 1866 and Adah Louisa married Charles Matthew LONGMORE in 1861.

Joseph Stockwell died in 1869 and was buried at Wylde on 8<sup>th</sup> February, aged 70. His wife Ann died in Bath and was buried at Wylde on 2<sup>nd</sup> August 1884, aged 83.
